TUNDRA BIOME DEFINITION OF A PRODUCER

Due to seasonally low temperatures, high winds and a permafrost layer, life is difficult for **arctic plants**. Most **arctic producers** are low-lying **plants**, such as moss, . Life in any **biome** includes **producers** (plants and other photosynthetic organisms) and **consumers** (organisms that obtain their energy from **producers**).Lichens dominate the **tundra** as the major primary **producer**. Many lichens can be. **Arctic** mites are found in and among the moss **plants** (left). The **Arctic** fly can . The Calliergon giganteum grows in the **arctic tundra** which is a harsh cold environment in the Northern Hemisphere within the **arctic** circle.
